I start a college course next week, my health is good and I’m very contented and very grateful.”

About Kairos Community Trust

This year, Kairos is celebrating its 25th anniversary. Our story started with the vision and commitment of Father John Kitchen and Tony Walsh and one semi-derelict property.

Today, Kairos Community Trust is a registered charity with 36 staff, more than 25 volunteers and 225 residents and clients – a thriving community of men and women recovering from lives of addiction and homelessness in our rehabs and 28 Move-on houses across five London boroughs (**Brent, Lambeth, Lewisham, Southwark and Wandsworth**).

Kairos has strong links with the local community and other organisations, including the Hepatology Unit at King’s College Hospital and Veteran’s Aid. We support continued training for staff and volunteers, and also take part in training new counsellors.

Our governing body is a trust and Kairos is managed and monitored by the trustees, who are independent volunteers from a wide range of professions in the community.

Why are we called Kairos?

Kairos is one of the Greek words for ‘time’ and at Kairos Community Trust, we understand it as the right time for change.



At Kairos Community Trust we are dedicated to helping homeless men and women with drug and alcohol problems. We do this through our detox and rehab programmes and our network of 28 supported Move-on houses, most of which are in south London. Addiction and homelessness are twin problems, and we believe that the journey to recovery from drugs and alcohol begins in a safe, secure environment

Kairos provides four treatment services, plus a large network of supported sober-living Move-on houses. At every stage, we help clients, referrers and care managers to decide what is the right service or combination of services that will be the best pathway to recovery for the individual.

How to apply

Kairos Community Trust accepts applications for all its services from men and women aged 18 to 65, regardless of their nationality, colour, religion, class, disability, sexual orientation, marital status. However, Kairos Community Trust does not accept applications from people with a history of arson or who are on the sex offenders' register.
